We're so glad your kids are learning about the Bible with us! Our prayer is that God's Word would be at the center of your homes and of the hearts of your children.

Knowing and loving the Bible is a life-long project, and your kids need your help!

Here are **five ways** you can help your kids love and know the Bible:

1. READ THE BIBLE — YOURSELF!

Yes, you. Do your kids see you reading the Bible? Do they know it's a book that you love and want to know more every day? Maybe the most important thing we can do for our kids is model for them the importance of loving it ourselves.

2. ENCOURAGE YOUR KIDS TO READ THE BIBLE.

If your kids can read, they can read the Bible! One of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) or Psalms is a great place to start with kids.

If your children are very young or can't read yet, read or tell them Bible stories. Our favorite storybook Bibles are **The Jesus Storybook Bible** by Sally Lloyd-Jones and **The Biggest Story Bible Storybook** by Kevin DeYoung.

3. SING THE BIBLE BOOKS!

4. TALK TO YOUR KIDS ABOUT WHAT THEY ARE LEARNING.

Ask your children to tell you what they've learned about the Bible.

5. PRACTICE NAVIGATING THE BIBLE.

One of our biggest hopes is that our kids would be confident using their Bible and finding specific passages. So help them practice!

Give them a book, chapter, and verse. And then work together to find it. Make it a family game if that sounds fun!
